

Logo Design Competition – Ignite Your Spirit

The Representative for Children and Youth is searching for a unique logo for this year's *Ignite Your Spirit* Indigenous Youth Forum. The successful logo will be used on all items related to *Ignite Your Spirit* including promotional materials, reports and give-away items.

Ignite Your Spirit seeks to amplify the voices of Indigenous young people in B.C. through youthled forums where they are able to share their needs, experiences and ideas for improving the child-serving system within a safe and supportive environment. The upcoming *Ignite Your Spirit* event will be hosted on Vancouver Island for Indigenous youth in care and in out-of-care options.

Ignite Your Spirit is about sparking a sense of strength and connection. It is about taking a match and starting a fire within a person and helping that person to grow their flame into something magnificent. The logo should represent a resurgence of culture and history in the youth of Indigenous peoples, something we are encouraging by helping youth to reclaim their spirit through knowledge and exploration of who they are.

Details:

The competition is open to First Nations, Métis and Inuit youth under the age of 30 residing on Vancouver Island. The logo should represent the meanings and intentions behind *Ignite Your Spirit*.

Please submit your artist bio and logo as separate files. Both files should include your first and last name.

Logo submissions should:

- Include an short artist biography along with a description of the logo
- Be in colour
- Preferably include images sent in a vector format (e.g., as a .pdf, .ai, or .eps file)

The successful logo will be selected by the Representative for Children and Youth's Indigenous Strategies and Partnerships team. Winners will be notified on May 30, 2017.
